- Roads, Intersections, & Sidewalks (\$11.15 mil)
 - Pass rate 81.38% in favor
- Parks and Recreation (\$5.25 mil)
 - Pass rate 72.09% in favor
- Town Center Redevelopment (\$4 million)
 - Pass rate 67.38% in favor

- Total Budget: \$4,262,000

Bond Information

- Voters authorized \$20.4 million
 - Authority to issue remaining \$10.7 million expires
 November 2020
 - Five year forecast assumes remaining bonds will be issued in FY 2019
 - \$2 million in debt service payments term April June 2018
 - Can get extension from LGC to issue as late as November 2023
 - Two-thirds issue if you need slightly more debt capacity, but only makes economic sense to issue as part of second issue (\$452k additional capacity in FY 2019)





Bailey Rd/Hwy 115 Improvements




- Add/extend turn lanes to all approaches of the Bailey Rd & Highway 115 intersection
- Final Construction plans are currently being reviewed by NCDOT.
- Budget: \$900K (\$2.1M estimated cost)
- Total Spent: \$134,875
- Project Schedule
 - Design began December2014
 - Right-of-Way Spring 2017
 - Construction Fall 2017

Gem Street Extension



- Extend Gem Street to Oak Street (additional improvements to Willow St.)
- Budget (Gem/Hickory): \$2,330,000
- Total Spent: \$509,550
- Project Schedule:
 - Design began January 2015
 - Property Acquisition will begin Spring 2017
 - Construction to start Fall 2017

Hickory St. Extension



- Extend Hickory St. to Lovers Lawn Trace
- Budget (Gem/Hickory): \$2,330,000
- Total Spent: \$509,550
- Project Schedule
 - Property Acquisition complete
 - Bids due mid February
 - Construction to start April 2017

Highway 21 Connector

- Connect Smith Circle to Highway 21. (no neighborhood connection)
- Budget: \$1,750,000
- Total Spent: \$72,805
- Project Schedule
 - Design Began November 2014
 - After numerous community/neighborhood meetings construction drawings are underway.
 - Drawings are currently being reviewed by NCDENR and NCDOT
 - Right-of-Way to begin Spring 2017
 - Construction Fall 2017



Bailey Road Realignment

- Kimley-Horn Associates began design March 2016.
- Conceptual design underway and concepts will be presented to Town Board upon completion of NCDOT & TRANSCO scoping discussion regarding the existing pipeline in the vicinity.
- Conceptual Design Budget: \$84,140
- Total Spent: \$41,473
- Assuming that the pipeline scoping discussions end favorably, Town staff will return to the Board with a follow-up KHA contract to commence the development of construction drawings; Phase 2 of the approved Transportation Bonds is a potential construction funding source (current cost estimate is \$5.75M)



Bailey Road Park Trails & Soccer Parking Lot Paving

 Scope: Add new exit drive from soccer parking lot and 20 new parking spaces. Repave existing asphalt trails.

• Total Spent: \$147,000

Schedule: COMPLETED FALL 2015








Bailey Road Park Tennis & Basketball Court Renovation

- Scope: Repave 3 existing tennis and 2 existing basketball courts.
- Total spent: \$166,000 including \$13,000 USTA Grant
- Schedule: COMPLETED FALL 2015





Multi-Park Restroom Renovations

- Scope: Renovate restrooms at Smithville, Torrence Chapel, Legion and Bailey Rd. Parks. Increase storage and add splash pad pump room at Smithville Park.
- Total spent: \$411,000
- Schedule: COMPLETED FALL 2015





Cornelius Elementary School Neighborhood Park

 Scope: 4 new T-ball fields, 2 new flag football fields, irrigation, lighting, ¼ mile walking trail, restroom and basketball court.

Total Spent: \$1,400,000






