MINUTES

- 1) Call to Order Chair Higgins called the meeting to order at 5:35 pm.
- 2) Determination of Quorum A quorum was reached with eight commissioners in attendance. Commissioners present: Rob McCloskey, Trey Fouche, Mary Wilson, Carol Livingston, Chris Kolkhorst, Chair Scott Higgins, Dave Rusk, Travis Dancy, and Town Commissioner Denis Bilodeau Commissioners absent: None Staff present: PARC Director Troy Fitzsimmons, Karen Ulmer

3) Approval of Minutes (December)

Commissioner Dancy made a motion to accept the minutes from the December 7, 2017, meeting as written. Commissioner Wilson seconded and the motion passed unanimously.

5) Presentations

a) Review of Summer Camp Sponsors

Director Fitzsimmons said feedback we have received from previous sponsors was in favor of a first-come, first served proposal process for major sponsorships instead of taking the highest bidder. We did that this year for summer camps. The announcement went out before Christmas and noted that we would not take them until January 3 at 3:00 pm, in order for any business interested in submitting to have time to submit. We received one proposal from Truliant Federal Credit Union for Gold Level Sponsorship at \$4,000. There is also some interest from a couple of businesses for in-kind sponsorships but no other cash offers yet. Silver and bronze sponsors are not exclusive and still have time to submit.

b)

Chair Higgins said he and Town Commissioner Bilodeau have been meeting with staff to discuss needs for the PARC department in the upcoming budget. Director Fitzsimmons distributed a spreadsheet with a 10-year comparison [see attached] The FY18 data highlighted in pink shows projected numbers since we are just halfway through this current fiscal year. A discussion followed regarding services provided for residents vs. non-residents, including issues such as quality of life, indirect revenue realized from non-residents, etc. Town Commissioner Bilodeau said he was concerned about how much of our expense is providing services to non-residents. Director Fitzsimmons also distributed the most recent budget comparisons versus other similar municipalities. Cornelius has more active acreage than many other municipalities.

6) Director's Report

Director Fitzsimmons highlighted the following items from his December 2017 report:

- We have reinstated a movie program at the arts center. We used to have six or more summer movies and attendance was not high enough, so we are attempting to spread them throughout the year. We held A Morning with the Grinch on December 6 with 60 in attendance and Parent's Night Out on December 15 with 32 registered kids, both events featuring film showings. We have another Parent's Night Out scheduled for Friday, February 16.

- The call for artists has been issued for this year's *Home Grown* exhibit. The reception will be held on February 2, 6:30-8:30 pm.

- We are working on agreement renewals with some of our partner organizations, including Lake Norman Giants, Lake Norman Little League, and Xtreme Lacrosse.

- A thank-you reception for PARC sponsors will be on January 31, 6:00-7:00 pm at D9 Brewing.

- c) Town Commissioner Report Commissioner Denis Bilodeau He thanked Director Fitzsimmons and PARC staff for putting numbers together in support of the PARC budget. The budget retreat will be held on March 7 and at the Graylyn Conference Center in Greensboro and commissioners are encouraged to attend.

8) Old Business

a) PARC Capital Improvements

Director Fitzsimmons highlighted the following projects:

- Antiquity Greenway: We are close to sending into the State our third and hopefully final submittal. A meeting with Charlotte Water is scheduled for tomorrow to discuss sequencing their water main and our greenway projects.

- ADA improvements at Legion Park: This project is ready for bid.

- Smithville Park playground: We are still finalizing the contract with Cunningham Recreation, working on the design and placement of the shade structures. We are still hoping for this project to be completed by May.

- James Hoyt Wilhelm Park paving: CMS has agreed to partner on this project by paving the bus lot, while we pave the teacher lot.

b) Future Cornelius Arts Center

Chair Higgins said there is a lot of work being done behind the scenes but nothing new to report. There have been three public hearings and a couple more will be held soon.

c) Regional Recreation Center

Still waiting for the first meeting to be scheduled by the County.

d) Future Park Capital Funding

Director Fitzsimmons said we are hoping for a bond referendum this fall. Town Commissioner Bilodeau said there will be a four-hour Town Board strategy session on Saturday, January 20 to begin discussing bonds. Director Fitzsimmons said the 2013 bonds included \$5.25 million for parks and recreation.

e) FY18 PARC Commission Goals & Committees

- Public Awareness: Commissioner McCloskey said the committee met with Ralph and Cameron Schaer from LKN App this afternoon and they are willing to work on improving the app to accommodate our needs to display park and greenway information. Commissioner Rusk said they are hoping to make it more user friendly and include links to Google Maps. Commissioner McCloskey will work with them on the Google Maps interface. Commissioner Wilson said she has found that many of our facilities and events are on Yelp and we should all add reviews. Positive social media reviews should get in front of the Town Board. She encouraged the group to leverage their own social networks as well.

- Strategic Planning: Director Fitzsimmons said this committee needs to meet to start working on PARC's bond request.

- Programs, Fees & Facilities: Facility rental fee increases approved by the PARC Commission last month were approved by the Town Board and went into effect on January, 2018.

9) New Business

a) 2018 Meeting Calendar

Director Fitzsimmons showed the proposed meeting calendar for 2018 [see attached], with PARC Commission Meetings scheduled for the first Thursday of each month. The first Thursday in April is during CMS spring break and in July it is the day after Independence Day. Commissioner Wilson made a motion to move the April PARC Commission meeting from April 5 to April 12 and move the July PARC Commission meeting from July 5 to July 12. Commissioner Rusk seconded and the motion passed unanimously.

10) Adjournment – Chair Higgins adjourned the meeting at 7:04 pm.
