MINUTES

1) Call to Order – Chair Higgins called the meeting to order at 5:30 pm.

2) Determination of Quorum – A quorum was reached with seven commissioners in attendance. Commissioners present: Rob McCloskey, Trey Fouche, Carol Livingston, Chris Kolkhorst, Andrew Heywood, Dave Rusk, Chair Scott Higgins, and Town Commissioner Denis Bilodeau Commissioners absent: Mary Wilson and Travis Dancy Staff present: Director Troy Fitzsimmons, Recreation Superintendent Chad Cauble, Special Events Program Manager Jody Clark, and Karen Ulmer

3) Approval of Minutes (September) – Commissioner Livingston made a motion to accept the minutes from the September 6, 2018, meeting as written. Commissioner Kolkhorst seconded and the motion passed unanimously.

4) Public Appearances – Citizen Concerns/Comments – None

5) Presentations

a) Sponsorship Policy

Director Fitzsimmons said that Ms. Clark and Mr. Cauble have been working on revising our sponsorship policy, based on feedback from the Programs, Fees and Facilities committee and existing and potential sponsors. Ms. Clark shared a presentation [see attached] reviewing current and proposed policies because interest in sponsoring our events from area businesses is growing and we are finding the need to adapt our current policy. She asked the commissioners to consider the proposals and be prepared to vote on those changes at the November PARC Commission meeting.

6) Director's Report

Director Fitzsimmons highlighted the following items from his September report:

- Special Events: Planning for All American Dog Show at Robbins Park on Saturday, October 6, 3:00 pm; Laketoberfest at Bailey Road Park on Saturday, October 20, 4:00 pm; Hooked on Cornelius at Robbins Park on Saturday, November 3, 10:00 am (new!); Veterans Day Program at Town Hall on Saturday, November 10, 11:00 am (family arts & crafts start at 9:30 am); Santa Paws in the Park at Robbins Park on Saturday, November 17, 12:00 pm (new!); and Light Up Cornelius at Town Hall on Saturday, November 24, 4:00 pm.

- McDowell Creek Greenway: We have secured the final easement, rushing to get right-of-way certification and construction authorization, and should be out to bid by early January 2019.

- Antiquity Greenway: Construction work has begun with surveying underway.

- Plum Creek Greenway: Plans are about 85% complete and working on final easements. Mecklenburg County hopes to begin construction in spring of 2019.

- Smithville-to-JV Washam Greenway: The first public workshop was held on Tuesday and about 25-30 people attended. Most were supportive. He handed out the map and fact sheet that was distributed at the meeting [see attached]. The consultant will have another public meeting in early 2019.

- The synthetic turf football field dedication at Bailey Road Park was held on September 12. All of our partners love it.

- Operations: Staff added some spectator seating pads at Westmoreland Athletic Complex, fields 2 and 4, since we cannot get grass to grow in these areas. We added charcoal grills at Robbins and Bailey Road Park shelter 3, thanks to the \$150,000 designated for park upkeep. Damage from Tropical Storm Florence was very minimal, just a few trees down. We are adding additional lights to the parking lot at Smithville Park. We have hired a new Park Maintenance Technician, Tony Bolt, to replace Matt Finn.

- Calendar of meetings for 2019: A calendar was shown with schedule of 2019 Town holidays and PARC Commission meeting dates – some dates may need to be changed. The group decided to cancel the January 3 meeting, which will be replaced with a joint towns/county meeting sometime that month, date TBD. The July meeting will be moved to July 11. June will be a personal conflict for Director Fitzsimmons but the group decided to keep the date as is, for now.

7) PARC Commissioner Recommendations & Reports

- a) Items to be placed on record None
- b) Commissioner Reports
 - Commissioner Rob McCloskey He attended the 'Tawba Walk and observed that the event has grown and the relationship with Bella Love seems very complementary. He spent time talking to Mindi Ellison at the Cornelius Arts Center and wants the PARC Commission to act as a sounding board. For the new center to be successful, we have to work together to move forward the successful current programming to the new space.
 - 2) Commissioner Trey Fouche He attended the Back-2-School Bash. It was well attended; his kids had a blast and he enjoyed it also. He went to the Home Grown: Sprouts reception and it was great. Upon leaving, they saw that Bella Love was having a drum circle in their space, and liked having those two events so close. He hopes the new art center can support both performing and visual arts.
 - 3) Commissioner Mary Wilson Absent
 - 4) Commissioner Carol Livingston No report
 - 5) Commissioner Chris Kolkhorst He attended the Bailey Road Park synthetic turf field dedication.
 - 6) Commissioner Andrew Heywood He attended the 'Tawba Walk. In talking to younger people he found out they did not seem aware of the event. We need to promote awareness with the younger crowd.
 - 7) Commissioner Dave Rusk He has been promoting the transportation bond referendum: including on Nextdoor and at his HOA meeting. Town Commissioner Bilodeau said there will be a public meeting to answer questions about the bond referendum on October 18. There is also a webpage, www.corneliusbonds.org.
 - 8) Commissioner Travis Dancy Absent
 - 9) Chair Scott Higgins He has seen many commissioners at events and appreciates the support. Visibility is so important. He thanked Town Commissioner Bilodeau for the coffee chats and his support of PARC.
- c) Town Commissioner Report Commissioner Denis Bilodeau He is the northern town representative on the Arts and Science Council and is now on two committees: Investment and Advocacy. They award block grants, though they are pulling back because their donations are way down. Chair Higgins said we have asked for support from ASC in the past and have been turned down. Commissioner Bilodeau said he has now been to five or six presentations regarding the transportation bond referendum. The cost to taxpayers may be just a penny, so the impact to the owner of a \$500,000 house would be \$50 a year.

8) Old Business

a) Future Cornelius Arts Center

Town Commissioner Bilodeau said it is now officially the Cain Center for the Arts and soon there will be more branding with the new name. They have \$12 million of the \$24 million they need and are still pursuing other donors for naming rights for different spaces within the center.

- Regional Recreation Center
 Commissioners Rusk and Livingston said there have not been any additional steering committee meetings.
 Director Fitzsimmons said the County is still doing design work and remain on schedule for a summer 2021 opening.
- c) PARC Commission Goals & Committees

Chair Higgins said the committee goals were discussed last month and still need some closure on goals for the Public Awareness committee. If commissioners have any questions about assignments let him know.

- Public Awareness: Commissioner McCloskey said they are getting ready to gear up. Director Fitzsimmons said Town Manager Andrew Grant was very appreciative of the upcoming *Lakeside Living* article Commissioner Wilson wrote in support of the transportation bonds.

- Strategic Planning & Long-Term Finance: Chair Higgins said the committee met this afternoon and they are moving forward on updating the CIP. They welcome any input from all commissioners.

- Programs, Fees & Facilities: Director Fitzsimmons said we are in the process of quantifying usage for the various facilities to determine if we have reasonable rates. What is the tipping point?

d) Donation Policy

Director Fitzsimmons said last month we approved a donation policy, and then received citizen feedback that the prices were out of reach for some. After some research, we found that while we want to move most parks towards a new standard steel bench, we still have some opportunities in natural areas for a lower priced bench. He shared a presentation highlighting the proposed changes [see attached]. We realized Mecklenburg County has a lifetime guarantee so we wanted to change our time guarantee also. In addition, we put in a separate time guarantee policy for corporate vs private donations. A discussion followed regarding that separate policy. Commissioner Fouche made a motion to approve the amended donation policy as presented. Commissioner Rusk seconded and the motion passed unanimously.

9) New Business

a) North Mecklenburg Joint Park Commissions Meeting

Director Fitzsimmons met with the park directors from Huntersville and Davidson, along with the director and deputy director from Mecklenburg County, to discuss having another joint meeting sometime in January. County Park and Recreation Director Lee Jones is very interested in ways we can collaborate to get more done in the north area, along the lines of what we are doing to get Plum Creek Greenway built.

- b) Individual PARC Commissioner Meeting with a Town Commissioner Chair Higgins wants individual PARC Commissioners to meet with individual Town Commissioners. It is important to build relationships with the Town Commissioners. The format and conversation topics would be up to each PARC Commissioner but he asked that we share our concerns and hear what is on their minds also. It is a chance for us to be clear with them about what is going on with PARC, not to ask them for anything, just to make sure they are well informed. We need to get their attention in a very austere budget time.
- c) Resolution of Support for Transportation Bonds

Director Fitzsimmons said he approached Town Manager Grant to ask whether it would be beneficial for the PARC Commission to pass a resolution of support for the transportation bonds. Commissioner McCloskey said all should consider that, though we support the bonds based on them including multi-use paths and sidewalks, etc., we need to recognize that the projects identified are not guaranteed. Commissioner Fouche said that is where the PARC Commission's advocacy can play a key role. Town Commissioner Bilodeau echoed the importance to get in front of the Town Board Commissioners. Commissioner Rusk made a motion to pass the Resolution of Support as presented. Commissioner Heywood seconded and the motion passed unanimously.

10) Adjournment – Chair Higgins adjourned the meeting at 7:27 pm.




Duke Energy FERC Relicensing Lake Cornelius **Informal Public** Access
